I am letting you all know about my travel plans so that in case if there is any need for any of you to visit with me, you are most welcome to do so before I leave to India. If for any reason, any of you would like to see me or have advance plans for any of the sacraments to be celebrated, you are most welcome to visit with me. If there is anything that needs my attention please let me know so that I can attend to it before I leave. As always **THANK YOU** for all that you do for the parish. Know that I will be missing you all during those three weeks. Please pray for my safe travel.

Blessed Holy Water Bottles from Easter Celebrations:

Please feel free to pick up a Blessed Holy Water Bottle which are at the back of Church after the Easter Vigil Mass and after the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Easter Sunday. You can use this water to bless your house and other things. They are available for your convenience.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY— *There will be one hour of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. during which we will be reciting the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.* We will have the procession with the image of Divine Mercy from the back of church right before the Mass begins. The Knights of Columbus will lead the procession.

How to observe the Feast of Divine Mercy

1. Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter
2. Confess your sins (20 days prior to the feast or 20 days after. One should have the interior disposition to complete semi-detachment from even venial sin).
3. Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father
4. Place complete trust in Jesus
5. Receive Communion on the Feast day
6. Venerate the image of the Divine Mercy
7. Be merciful to others through actions, words, and prayers.
