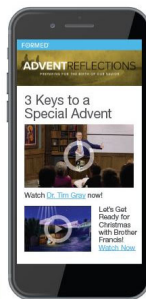

No “yours” or “mine”:

Celebrating the Most Holy Trinity

There is an Indian folk tale about three blind men who examine an elephant to try to determine what sort of animal it might be. One grabs hold of the elephant's tail and exclaims, “This creature is very like a rope.” The second man runs his hand over one of the tusks, declaring, “This creature is very like a spear.” Finally, the third man, patting the wide, solid side of the elephant, says, “This creature is surely a wall.” Individually, each of the blind men grasped *an aspect* of the majestic creature, but their understanding was limited. But, by sharing their insights, they were given an understanding of elephants than none of them could have alone.

Like the experience of those three men, all of the Church's various celebrations throughout the year work together to help us enter more deeply into the mysteries of salvation and the ways that God has been—and continues to be—at work in the world. This Sunday's celebration honoring the Most Holy Trinity is no exception.

Falling as it does on the Sunday after Pentecost, this day honoring the Trinity brings together all the mysteries that we have celebrated during the seasons of Lent and Easter: the creative, saving, and sanctifying work of God that not only freed us from the powers of sin and death, but which also unites us as a community of faith—the Church.

In the end, our celebration of Trinity Sunday is an invitation for us to continue to move beyond our selves and our own sense of “mine.” God continues to bless us—in the ongoing act of creation, in the freely given gifts of healing and redemption of Christ, and the life-giving Spirit that inspires faith, hope, and love—and invites us to receive the graces and gifts he so freely gives.
